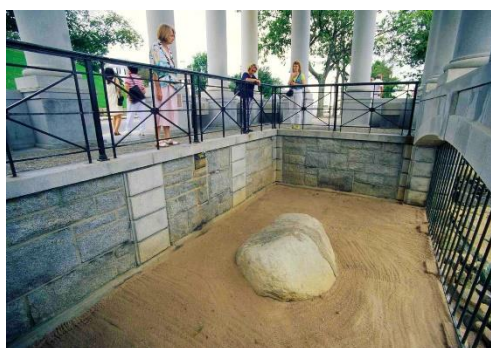

5:30pm-7:00pm Home ported in Newport, RI, the “Sailing Capital of the World”, the *Adirondack II* Sunset Sail Cruise will take us by Newport’s stately bayside mansions, a 19th Century military fort and beautiful old lighthouses. The sweeping vistas of Newport and Jamestown will provide the perfect backdrop for our sailing cruise adventure. The Newport RI sightseeing is all about getting on the water by boat and taking it all in while soaking in the sun and hopefully witnessing an absolutely gorgeous Sunset!

The *Adirondack II* is an elegant, 80-foot, turn-of-the-century-style pilot schooner that has been a local mainstay in Newport since it joined the Scarano boat fleet in 1999. It has entertained thousands of Newport visitors and locals, and has attracted a large and growing number of passionate regulars who can’t stop coming back for more. The Schooner *Adirondack II* features plenty of seating, teak decks and impressive mahogany trim. It has all the elements of a turn of the century pilot schooner and would have looked right at home in Narragansett Bay 100 years ago. The rig on *Adirondack II* is held in place with Kevlar shrouds, and her underbody carries external ballast taking advantage of modern wooden boat building techniques. The modern underbody is certainly designed in the spirit of the original pilot schooners, which used all the technology available to them to make their vessels as fast and yet as safe as possible.

Built for speed, pilot schooners were the coastal guide and rescue boats in the bygone era of sail. The primary purpose of the pilot schooner was to deliver a pilot (a seaman with knowledge of local waterways) to the incoming ships to guide them into safe port. Operation of a pilot schooner was a highly competitive business. The fastest schooners were the ones that got their pilots the most work. Pilot schooners patrolled the harbors and often rescued vessels arriving late at night from the dangers of an unfamiliar coastline in dark and threatening waters. 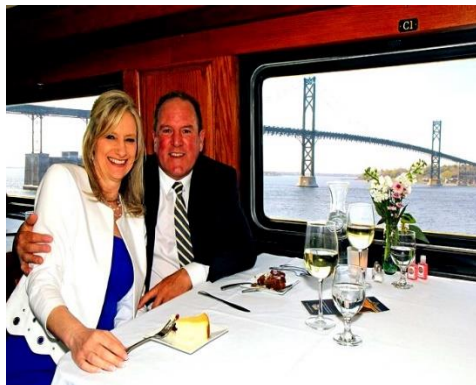

The Shore Line Trolley Museum maintains several diverse collections of equipment, photographs, documents, and artifacts which preserve the history and heritage of the Trolley Era. The museum owns nearly 100 vintage transit vehicles, in addition, the museum archives contain nearly 65,000 photographic images, over 4,000 books and documents, and about 1,000 small artifacts such as tokens, hat badges and ticket punches.

The Shore Line Trolley Museum's vehicle collection is diverse both in terms of geographic reach and chronological spread. Included in the collection are some of America's oldest single-truck cars, many examples of wooden and steel streetcars from the Golden Era of street railways, and several modern and representatives from the high-speed and streamlined era. Rapid Transit (Elevated and Subway), Interurban and work cars round out the collection.

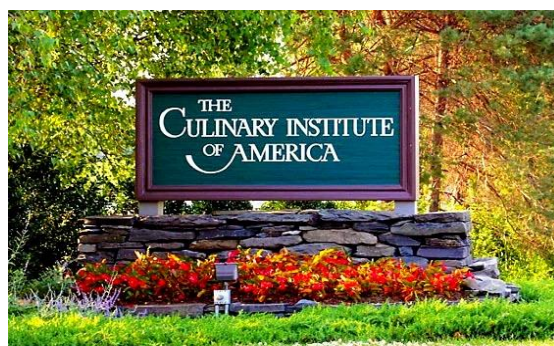

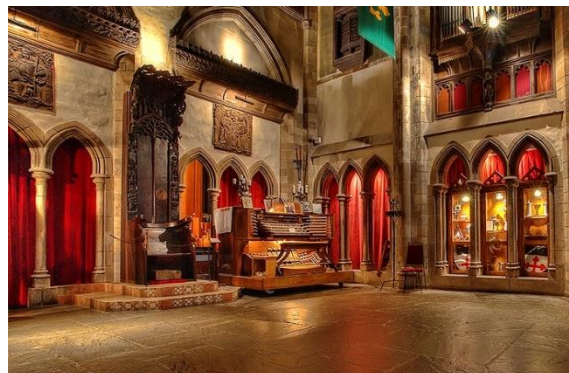

Hammond Castle was built in the late 1920's by scientist, inventor, and interestingly enough, an art connoisseur of the highest order, John Hays Hammond, Jr (1888-1965). Sitting high on a bluff overlooking the Atlantic Ocean, the castle brings together a unique combination of art, architectural elements and culture, backstopped by many innovative technological applications, yet unknown and unseen by the visitor.

Hammond was widely traveled, but had been exposed to the art and architecture of old European at an early age. He appreciated the eras spanning ancient times, through the medieval period, and into the Renaissance. He purchased a broad collection of artifacts for display, and created his residence around large stone archways, windows, wooden facades, and other architectural elements from the Old World. He was aptly described as a man of the future, but who chose to live in the past. The building he left behind is one of the truly unique structures on this continent, where visitors can experience being immersed in a true old European environment without actually being there.
